

## FAQs – Chapter 9

### Can a singular noun take a plural suffix, and a plural noun take a singular suffix?

Yes. Consider the example בְּנָיִם (his sons). This is a plural noun with a 3ms pronominal suffix. Remember that singular nouns have Type 1 pronominal suffixes and plural nouns have Type 2 pronominal suffixes. This is especially important to note in the case of masculine plural nouns which lose the ם ending before a pronominal suffix.
